

The Southern Tier Overdose Prevention Program (STOPP) is a community-based opioid overdose prevention and Narcan distribution program

Overdose symptoms include:

- Vomiting
- Breathing is slow and shallow (less than 10 breaths per minute) or has stopped
- Blue or greyish skin, lips, and fingernails
- Choking or loud snoring noises
- Will not respond to sternum rub





# WHAT ARE OPIATE DRUGS?

Opiates include both heroin and prescription pain medications

Common opioids include:

Heroin Oxycontin Vicodin Methadone Percocet Fentanyl

# OVERDOSE RISK FACTORS

### Mixing Drugs:

with alcohol, benzodiazepines, or anti-depressants causes many overdoses

### **Lowered Tolerance**

Tolerance can decrease rapidly when someone has taken a break from using a substance since getting treatment or being incarcerated

# **Health Problems**

Mixing heroin or prescription opioids Opioids can impact your ability to breathe. If you have asthma or other breathing problems you are at a higher risk for an overdose

### **Previous Overdose**

A person who has experienced a nonfatal overdose in the past, has increased risk of a fatal overdose in the future
